AESTHETIC FACTORS:

Colour: contrast, complimentary

Scale: size, proportion

Harmony: symmetry / asymmetry
Line: curve, straight, parallel, angular
Shape: negative shapes, pattern

Emphasis: focal point, eye direction,

movement

Balance

Texture

Movement: Rhythym

Theme / Design Movement

ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS:

Re-usability: Are the materials recycled or

reused from another product?

Economic / Efficiancy: Are the materials

used to their full capacity?

Are the materials expensive?

Waste: What waste is generated? Can this

be reduced? Reused etc.

End of life: Can this be recycled? Or simply

put to waste?

Sustainability: Are the materials sustainable?

ie: Pine vs. Mahogany

FUNCTIONAL FACTORS:

Construction: joinery, bracing, support

Materials: wood, sheet metal, plastic,

concrete

Ergonomics: Does the design follow rules of

comfort for people?

Maintenance: Will this design be difficult to

fix/clean/maintain/check?

Strength + Durability: Can the design withstand heavy use? Does the material dent?

Multi-use / Single-use
Useability / User Friendly

HUMAN FACTORS:

Accessibility: Who will be using it?

Are wheelchairs + physically disabled people able to interact? People with hearing / reading / speaking / vision impairments -

how does it effect them?

Interaction: Shelter? Seating? What can

people do with the design?

Clarity of use: Do you need to provide instructions? Or is it self-explanatory?

Engagement: Is it engaging? How can you

tell?

Pleasure: Does your design make people happy? Comfortable? Relaxed? Excited?
