Brief

(taken from the Young Designers Awards)

Everyone gathers at Emma and Andy's home. Their parents have decided to make a dedicated place for these friends separate from the house and one that fully integrates within the garden environment.

Specs

(taken from the Young Designers Awards):

You need to consider the following things:

- The new building needs to have a footprint no larger than 25m²
- The building must be multi-purpose and flexible in its layout and configuration
- Groups of up to 10 people need to be accommodated
- The garden environment the building will sit in needs to be considered
- The building is single storey

Project Requirements:

In your portfolio you will apply visual communication and design techniques and knowledge to *initiate*, *explore*, and *refine* your ideas for the ideas for your teenager sleepout.

Your portfolio must show the progression of your design ideas and could include visual diaries, sketches, drawings, models, photographs, digital media, display boards, or installations, supported by annotations as required. Creating your portfolio involves four stages:

1. Initial research
2. Initial ideas
3. Ideas development
4. Final Design

Task one:

You need to set up the first page of your visual diary:

- Paste in the brief and specs
- Brainstorm with a partner the requirements for a teenage space you can think of as a teenager: what takes priority?
ie: comfortable sleeping space (remember it must accommodate 10), an area to prepare food? toilet (1 or 2?), big screen / entertainment system? Outside area for lawn games?
- Outdoor area must be considered as well
- Flexible layout
